

WOMEN'S GOLF

CODE OF CONDUCT AND ETHICS 2016

It is the Union's objective to ensure that all players and officials representing Southern Cape Women's Golf (hereafter known as SCWG) be identified through their exemplary behaviour, both on and off the course.

This will be achieved as much through attitude and behaviour towards fellow competitors, opponents, team mates and officials, as through the standard of play.

Players are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner which will reflect favourably on themselves and the SCWG and to protect and honour the Union's colours.

The principles as laid down by the Royal & Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and the Women's Golf Association are to adhere to at all times with special regard to:

- 1. The Rules
- 2. Equity and conduct
- 3. Standard of fair play
- 4. Sportsmanlike conduct
- 5. Golf etiquette

Players and officials, when travelling on public transport to and from tournaments while representing the Union shall wear SCWG uniform as stipulated in the Guidelines for SCWG Squad and Team.

The dress code of WGSA on the golf course and the host club in the clubhouse must be adhered to by all players.

Examples of inappropriate and or unacceptable behaviour inviting disciplinary action would include:

- 1. Testing positive for any substances and methods prohibited at all times (in and out of competition) as per the World Anti-Doping Agency, current prohibited list. For your convenience the list is web-linked on the SCWG website (www.scwga.co.za)
- 2. Smoking or the use of alcohol by players under the age of 18 years
- 3. Defacing or damaging of kit, clothing or property
- 4. Rough play, throwing of clubs, damaging the course etc.
- 5. Abusive and foul language
- 6. Conduct which may bring the game into disrepute
